FIREWORK DISPLAY ON SUNDAY, 11 NOVEMBER 2018

Various activities are being arranged nationwide on Sunday, 11 November 2018, to mark the day 100 years ago that the guns fell silent at the end of the First World War. At 7 pm on that date, more than 1,000 beacons will be lit across the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories. At 7.05 pm bells will be rung in churches and cathedrals throughout the country. Luppitt parish is taking part in these activities.

As part of this commemoration, a bonfire will be lit at Hartridge and there will be a firework display. This notice is to give prior warning to all parishioners who have animals who may be affected by the fireworks.

AN INVITATION TO GET INVOLVED IN PLANNING THE FUTURE OF LUPPITT

For many of you, the Neighbourhood Plan development programme will be well known — we've been talking about it for quite a while now. For the newer members of our community you may not have had time to stay abreast of what has happened in the past which will ultimately determine the future shape of our community in lots of ways.

For instance, should we, as a community, plan to develop renewable energy facilities like solar panels or a hydroelectric plant driven by the River Otter?

What about the housing supply? Would local families benefit from affordable housing or perhaps live and work units? Perhaps we could attract more small scale employment into the parish. Or would accommodation specifically for older people be appropriate including maybe some sheltered housing?

And how do we feel about the facilities in the village? Currently Luppitt falls short of the Government classification of a 'sustainable environment'. That's because we don't have a basic core of four elements which are classified as being 'sustainable'. Would we like more facilities on our doorstep? What about a community-owned, not-for-profit farm shop, selling local produce and as a place to meet friends for a cup of tea? What additional facilities would be useful for young families?

We live in one of the most unspoilt rural areas in the West Country. As development pressures increase to build new houses for our expanding national population, how do we protect this special place and its natural environment for future generations?

All these things, and much more, have been woven into a first draft of a Neighbourhood Plan. Now, a team of twenty local residents have come together to develop that draft into a working document which we hope will ultimately encapsulate the views and wishes of the people who live in the parish.

Having a Neighbourhood Plan can bring all sorts of benefits to the community, but it needs your involvement.

How can you get involved? ...

- Take a look if you haven't seen it already, have a look at the first draft of the Plan. You will find it on the Luppitt Parish Council website (www.luppittparishcouncil.co.uk)
- Have your say by joining the monthly meetings the Steering Group meets every month in the Village Hall. The meetings are open to any member of the Parish and we welcome all who want to come along and be involved. This Plan has to accurately interpret the views and wishes of the people who live in the Parish so the Steering Group needs your input. The next three meeting dates are 25th July, 29th August and 26th September, starting at 7.30pm.
- Join one of the Steering Group working parties there is a lot of research and discussion work to be done and we would welcome more participants in the sub groups.
- Stay in touch If you can't make the monthly meetings, but would like to be kept up to date with the Plan's progress, let us know. Minutes of the monthly Steering Group meetings are available on the Luppitt Parish Council website. If you would rather have a copy delivered directly to you, we can arrange that via email or post.

Receive apologies for absence

Apologies were received from PCSO 30017 Darren England.

Minutes of previous meeting

The Minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday, 1 May 2018, were unanimously agreed and signed as a correct record of that meeting (proposed by Cllr Pulman and seconded by Cllr Brake).

Declaration of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

The meeting was then suspended to allow Questions from the Public

A firework display, to coincide with the lighting of beacons nationwide, is due to be held in November on Hartridge as part of the centenary celebrations for the end of World War 1. One parishioner present had come to express concern over the effect the fireworks may have on horses nearby. The Chairman undertook to keep the parishioner fully informed and it was agreed that the clerk will put a notice in the Luppitt Packet for the next four editions about the fireworks so that all parishioners with animals that may be affected will be fully informed.

The meeting then resumed.

PLANNING

Applications (for comment, support or objection)
18/1005/FUL – The Old Post Office – various works

The clerk had checked with Planning East but the officer dealing with this was away. Cllr Key advised that there had been amendments made to the Listed Building Consents part of the application and a new planning application reference is automatically assigned at the same time. The Parish Council supports this planning application.

Neighbourhood Plan

The Chair of the Steering Group (Roger Hicks) was away and the clerk updated the Parish Council on progress. There had been two meetings of the Steering Group, both held in the Village Hall and both had been well attended. The group had been divided into sub-groups and each sub-group was studying and considering a section of the consultation draft document. Five further meetings of the Steering Group have been booked in the Village Hall – 27 June, 25 July, 29 August, 26 September and 31 October. A spokesperson from each sub-group will report on progress at these meetings.

Terms of Reference

The Steering Group of the Neighbourhood Plan is now very large and it was felt sensible to create a Steering Group Committee to make the process more manageable and to drive it forward. This will be discussed and agreed at the next Steering Group meeting. The clerk had drawn up revised wording for the Terms of Reference for the Steering Group which was discussed and amendments suggested. The clerk will forward to the Chair of the Steering Group for his input.

Parishes Together

Cllr Tucker has carried out the ditch clearing work so the clerk will apply for the grant from the Parishes Together fund.

Gigaclear

Cllrs Nancarrow and Tucker had met Mike Cavanagh of Gigaclear to discuss the Parish Council's concerns over the work being carried out by contractors on behalf of Gigaclear. Any complaint must be raised within 2 years. Gigaclear and the contractors will be held accountable for up to 5 years to make good any problem areas. Cllr Key had another contact at Gigaclear and he will pass on the details to the clerk.

Cllr Brake, on behalf of the Commoners, said that Gigaclear have not yet sent the wayleave agreement so no agreement has yet been reached.

Progress on long-standing complaints

There is a new Neighbourhood Highways Officer who is not familiar with the roads in Luppitt. Several roads have been marked within the parish. It appears that the NHO came out to mark the roads, then another person comes to price the works before they can be entered onto the system. The Parish Councillors thought this was a complete waste of time. The clerk will email the NHO passing on this point of view.

Road sweeping

Roads that need sweeping – Shelf Lane, Smithenhayes up to Halsdon, Beacon to Ford Bridge, Ringborough Cross to Fairview, Millrise to the Mill. The clerk will pass on this information to Cllr Chubb for action.

Lengthsman

The clerk will apply to the Highway Maintenance Community Enhancement Fund for £2,000 towards the costs of engaging a lengthsman for Luppitt. This amount will be matched by the same amount from the precept. At the same time, the clerk will liaise with the NHO on the procedure to follow to apply for funding for a lengthsman from Highways' budget.

Community Policing Report

GARDEN JOTTINGS

Last Christmas I was given a couple of Dutch amaryllis bulbs. All you have to do is pot them up, water a little, keep them reasonably warm, and Bob's your uncle - big blowsy flowers. One was apple blossom pink and the other white with two, yes, two flower buds.

Really of course they're hippeastrums, not amaryllises, or pedantically amaryllides. Or what about two amaryllis? You have two deer, so why not two amaryllis?

Anyway they are hippeastrums, though I wouldn't be at all surprised if this name hasn't been changed nowadays. Amaryllis is a near hardy usually pink summer flowering bulb from South Africa. I'm inclined to think this one's had a change of name recently too. It grew and flowered outside in my mother's front garden at 128 Great West Road just outside London in the fifties. And it's been doing well in our poly here.

Hippeastrums wouldn't normally grow outside in this country. I remember seeing lots of red hippeastrums in flower in a public park in Rabat. I expect they're pretty common in Mediterranean places. Allegedly hardy hippeastrums have been introduced in England in the last few years, but I haven't had any luck with them.

Hippeastrums belong to a large group of bulbs native to South America. Here they grow over wide areas with a variety of climates from tropical lowlands to high and cold mountain slopes. They all have typical black seeds. I have only managed to germinate forms from fairly low altitudes. Some of the alpine types are said to have brilliant flowers, rather like tulips in Asia.

They all have deep fleshy drought resistant roots, enduring long dry spells in steep places. Rain at the wrong time of the year rots the bulbs. As with many mountain species grown under cover, adequate ventilation is also a problem. Rhodolirions and Rhodophialas are among these.

Hippeastrums and amaryllis belong to a large family of flowering bulbs, mainly in warmer regions. Botanically they all have similarly formed female flowering parts. Snowdrops and daffodils also belong to this group.

Bulbs, often greenhouse bulbs, like Crinums Sprekelias. Clivias, Nerines are all amaryllidaceae. Nowadays plant specialists have developed inter-species hybrids like Amarines, Amarcrinums, Hippeasprekelias. If you succeed with them, they will usually repay you with large spectacular flowers. Certainly our apple blossom amaryllis in the window managed to catch the eye of our neighbour driving past.





Revd John Hayhoe

Many of us remember the Spycatcher trial, a trial that managed to guarantee the success of the book Spycatcher by Peter Wright, a former M15 officer, as the British Government try to ban – the net result was that the books notoriety and profit became guaranteed. During the trial Malcolm Turnbull, later Prime Minster of Australia, questioned Robert Armstrong, the British Cabinet Secretary about a particular letter

Q: So that letter contains a lie, does it not?

A: It contains a misleading impression in that respect.

Q: Which you knew to be misleading at the time you made it?

A: Of course.

Q: So it contains a lie?

A: It is a misleading impression, it does not contain a lie, I don't think.

Q: What is the difference between a misleading impression and a lie?

A: You are as good at English as I am.

Q: I am just trying to understand.

A: A lie is a straight untruth.

Q: What is a misleading impression – a sort of bent untruth?

A: As one person said, it is perhaps being economical with the truth.

As we read our papers, be it about Brexit from leavers or remainers, or news from The White House, or a multitude of other sources, we hear of truth being bent, matters of great importance being covered up. It is no wonder that many people have become extremely sceptical about almost everything of which they hear unless they have indeed heard it 'straight from the horse's mouth'. Often the truth has been bent or someone has been economical with it just to save face. Saving face is understandable because we all wish to be in good standing with our peers. This is however quite a danger for Christians, and for everyone else. Churches around the world, and of all denominations,

have found their reluctance to acknowledge and expose the horrors of paedophiles deeply damaging just as they have about extravagancy, dishonesty and fraud. It takes real courage to face the danger of unpopularity by telling those in authority of such abuse against a person or organisation. It is a truism as we are told in John 8:32 that 'the truth will make you free'.

On the domestic scene, in our relationships with friends and family, we often decide that telling the truth "tempers the wind to the shorn lamb", that is that we do not necessarily help a situation by blurting out a painful truth or criticizing some particular behaviour. Love in relationships at home and in our community must always take into consideration the personality of the person with whom we are talking, their areas of sensitivity and vulnerability. Telling it 'as it is' rarely helps. Most of us can cope with kindly criticism, with a disguised suggestion that there might another way to do something, that a different course of action might go down better. Doing everything 'in Christ' does work and enables us to march onwards to tomorrow and the next day in love with one another, just as we have been taught.




